HISTORICAL SHOWS / FLASHES OF GLORY

Throughout the summer, Paris and its region offer amazing experiences, from spectacular fireworks displays to quirky candlelit tours and historical shows in illustrious surroundings.

THE FRENCH GAME OF THRONES



Listed as a UNESCO World Heritage site, the medieval walled city of Provins invites you to step back in time to the Middle Ages. Until 3/11, relive two age-old traditions: falconry with The Eagles of the Ramparts and jousting with The Legend of the Knights. Until 2/07, The Age of the Ramparts recounts the history of knights and their weapons. For total immersion, The Medieval Festival of Provins recreates the famous Champagne Fairs (15 & 16/06).

3 NIGHT AT THE INVALIDES SHOW


From 27/06 to 1/09, the monumental **Night at the Invalides show**, *Lutèce 3,000 ans d'histoires*, tells the 3,000-year-old tale of Paris, projected onto the façades of the iconic courtyard of the Hôtel des Invalides. In this spectacular setting, immersed in a fantastic narrative that covers the Gauls to Louis XIV, Napoléon to the military leaders, meet those who shaped yesterday's Lutetia and today's Paris.

Every summer, complete with deckchairs and blankets, the grassy lawn of the Parc de la Villette turns into a gigantic open-air cinema. This year, it's back to the future at the **Open-air cinema**, with a selection of films on the theme of "tomorrow".


Music soothes the soul — or so they say.







Wander with Renor

from the banks of the Seine to Montmartre

The journey begins with a tribute to the master. In Chatou, restage the scene from the Luncheon of the Boating Party at the famous Maison Fournaise⁽⁰⁾, where you can dine on a wonderful terrace overlooking the Seine. Its museum recalls those carefree days. Then follow the Impressionist Trail, dotted with reproductions of their paintings, and admire the landscapes the inspired them. All throughout the summer, from Chatou to Bougival, you can relive scenes from Renoir's time at the popular dances and guinguettes and on boat trips organised for the centenary of his death.

After the banks of the Seine, head to Montmartre, immortalised in the renowned painting Dance at the Moulin de la Galette. Go to the Musée de Montmartre⁽¹⁾ to revisit the heyday of the "Butte" where Renoir had his studio. Those seeking a unique experience can continue the Impressionist journey around the capital in a retro-style Citroen 2 CV convertible with 4 roues sous 1 parapluie.

through Paris' most popular museums

The Musée Marmottan Monet⁽¹⁾ has the largest collection of works by the famous artist, including the iconic *Impression, Sunrise*, while the Musée de l'Orangerie⁽²⁾ plays host to his monumental Water Lilies murals. Don't miss either. Finish with a flourish at the Musée d'Orsay⁽³⁾, home to the world's largest collection of Impressionist paintings. If you're looking for something unusual, why not take a cookery course inspired by Monet's recipe book and organised by Normandy Melody (normandy-melody.com).

Top tip: On the list of must-see Impressionist collections is the Musée Marmottan Monet's Berthe Morisot collection, the biggest in the world. The Musée d'Orsay, meanwhile, is home to the world's second-biggest collection of works by van Gogh.

Discover Auvers and the Oise Valley,

with Vincent, Daubigny and C. Tisserro

Van Gogh spent the last 70 days of his life in Auvers-sur-Oise, producing more than 80 paintings there. Following in his footsteps feels almost like a pilgrimage. His room at the Auberge Ravoux, known as the "House of van Gogh", has been conserved as it was at the time. Discover the landscapes immortalised by the artist on a walk through the village, to the cemetery where he lies.

The landscape painter Daubigny was the first to move to Auvers, before van Gogh. Don't miss his home studio, its walls decorated with his paintings, as well as others by the likes of Corot, Daumier and more. A museum is also devoted to him. This summer, it features an exhibition on the painter Corot.

Take a step back into the history of Impressionism at the Château d'Auvers, overlooking the village. An impressive immersive experience takes you from the birth of Impressionism to its successors.

To get the the full picture, head to Pontoise and the Musée Camille Pissarro. Pisarro's arrival in this neighbouring town contributed to the vibrant art scene that emerged in the area (17 rue du Château).

In the footsteps of F. Milles, Sisley and & Caille both

in Barbizon, Moret-sur-Loing and Yerres

Get back to nature with a visit to Barbizon. Discover the haunts of France's landscape artists, the precursors of Impressionism. Leaving their studios, they painted in the open air in the forest of Fontainebleau, and were regulars at the Auberge Ganne. Now home to the Musée des peintres de Barbizon, the old inn gives an idea of what the area was once like. Don't miss the Musée Jean-François Millet, where he painted masterpieces including The Angelus and The Gleaners.

Two great Impressionist painters later made their homes in the area. Sisley lived in Moret-sur-Loing for the last 20 years of his life. The Sisley trail rambles through this charming medieval town, pausing at viewpoints that inspired the painter.

Caillebotte was a regular visitor to his family home in Yerres, which is featured in some of his major paintings. The delightfully preserved 11-hectare park can be explored in augmented reality (digital tablets available for hire).

1 OMENS, LABORATORIES FOR NEW ARCHITECTURAL PRACTICES

How can we adapt architectural practices to the major urban challenges of the 21st century? Experts from France and abroad share their forward-looking visions in an innovative and immersive way at the École Nationale Supérieure d'Architecture, located in the former stables of the Château de Versailles (Avenue de Sceaux). For the occasion, the galleries that house the casts of ancient masterpieces from the Louvre museum and marble sculptures from the gardens of Versailles will be open making for a fascinating visit in every way. Meanwhile, La Maréchalerie, the school's centre for contemporary art, gives carte blanche to artist Didier Fiúza Faustino and his Lampedusa project, which deals with the issue of migration, escape and refuge - another great challenge of our century. Free admission.





2 VERSAILLES. DREAMS OF ARCHITECTURE. 1660-1815

No superlative is too great for the **Château de Versailles**. Nonetheless, there have been architects who would have liked to alter the façades that are so familiar to us today. In the north wing of the château, the exhibition brings together the bold, innovative projects which, for three centuries, aimed to transform this iconic monument — but never succeeded. Discover the palace has it might have been through more than 100 original, utopian drawings.

3 A TASTE FOR LANDSCAPE

How can we enhance the city by placing it in harmony, rather than conflict, with its natural environment? That is the issue raised by the École Nationale Supérieure de Paysage, located in the **Potager du Roi** (10, rue du Maréchal Joffre). Bathed in history and surrounded by the gardens that once supplied the king's table, today it is a think tank spawning ideas for the future "nature city", a city that is productive, eco-responsible and welcoming. The many staged and special events throughout the visit invite visitors to discover the produce from local farmers who have chosen sustainable, organic, experimental or traditional agriculture.



ON THE HORIZON FOR 2030. THE PROJECTS AND AIMS FOR THE GRAND PARIS EXPRESS

Located in the **former postal building** (Avenue de Paris), the Horizon 2030 pavilion spotlights the major projects of yesteryear and tomorrow, and in particular those related to Grand Paris (Greater Paris). Watch the projects take shape, as if you were part of the hive of activity at major architecture practices. Immersive projects, unusual designs and dozens of models of train stations transport you to the Greater Paris of the future, with its neighbourhoods, squares and avenues. Free admission.

5 VERSAILLES, CITY OF NATURE – PERMANENCE AND CREATION

With this exhibition, the **Espace Richaud** – **the former chapel of Versailles' royal hospital** (78 Boulevard de la Reine) – provides a photo journey through the major urban projects undertaken in the municipality and explains how the city, a pioneer in France's zero-pesticide movement, is tackling these architectural, environmental and landscaping challenges at its own level. Free admission.
