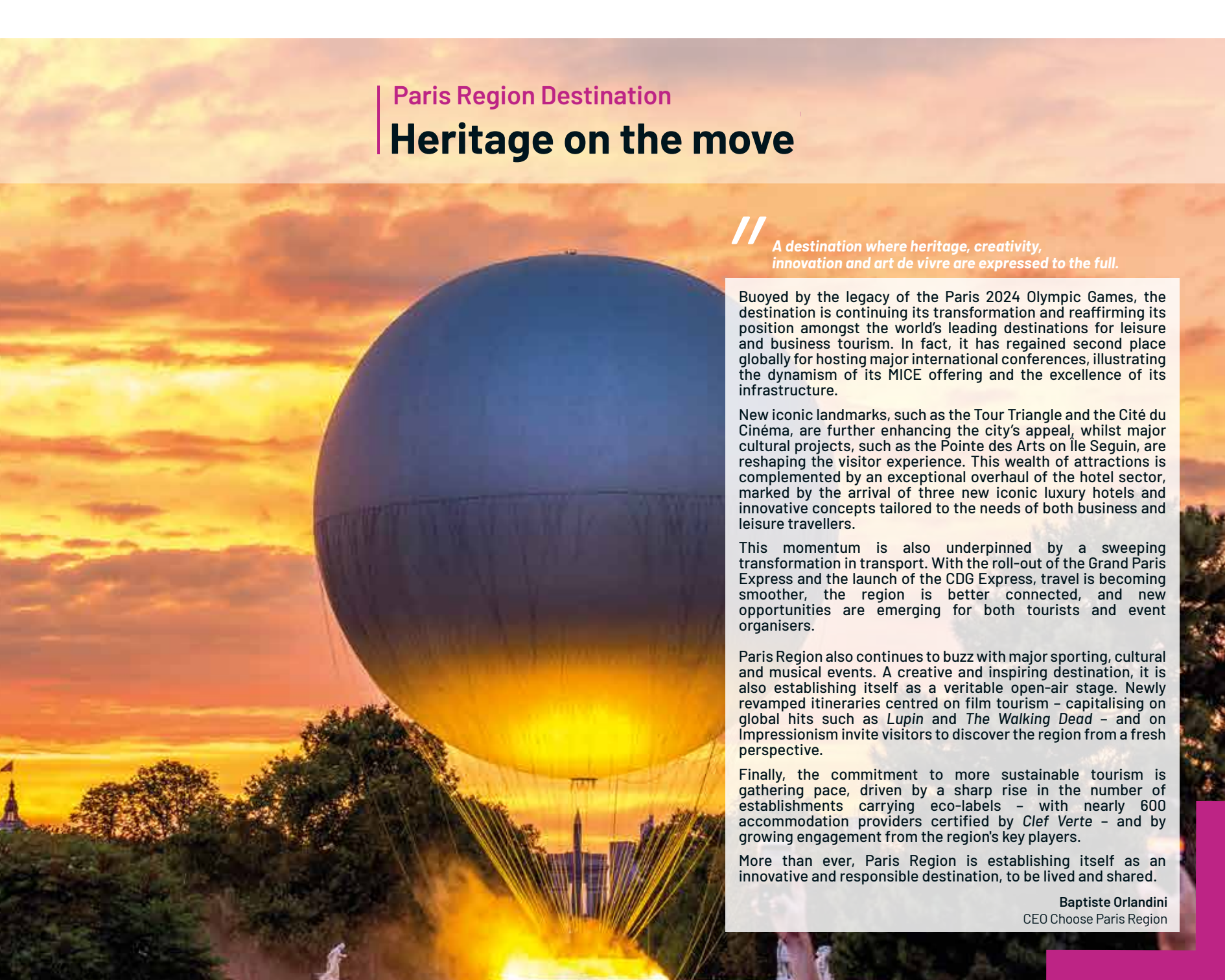

A destination where heritage, creativity, innovation and art de vivre are expressed to the full.

Buoyed by the legacy of the Paris 2024 Olympic Games, the destination is continuing its transformation and reaffirming its position amongst the world's leading destinations for leisure and business tourism. In fact, it has regained second place globally for hosting major international conferences, illustrating the dynamism of its MICE offering and the excellence of its infrastructure.

New iconic landmarks, such as the Tour Triangle and the Cité du Cinéma, are further enhancing the city's appeal, whilst major cultural projects, such as the Pointe des Arts on Île Seguin, are reshaping the visitor experience. This wealth of attractions is complemented by an exceptional overhaul of the hotel sector, marked by the arrival of three new iconic luxury hotels and innovative concepts tailored to the needs of both business and leisure travellers.

This momentum is also underpinned by a sweeping transformation in transport. With the roll-out of the Grand Paris Express and the launch of the CDG Express, travel is becoming smoother, the region is better connected, and new opportunities are emerging for both tourists and event organisers.

Paris Region also continues to buzz with major sporting, cultural and musical events. A creative and inspiring destination, it is also establishing itself as a veritable open-air stage. Newly revamped itineraries centred on film tourism – capitalising on global hits such as *Lupin* and *The Walking Dead* – and on Impressionism invite visitors to discover the region from a fresh perspective.

Finally, the commitment to more sustainable tourism is gathering pace, driven by a sharp rise in the number of establishments carrying eco-labels – with nearly 600 accommodation providers certified by *Clef Verte* – and by growing engagement from the region's key players.

More than ever, Paris Region is establishing itself as an innovative and responsible destination, to be lived and shared.

Situated at the heart of the former Athletes' Village for the Paris 2024 Olympic Games and just a stone's throw from the key Saint-Denis Pleyel station (line 14, then lines 15, 16 and 17), the Cité du Cinéma is both a cultural destination and a vibrant community space, with a programme centred on four cornerstones: cinema, the performing arts, music and media.

Its 12,000 m² of flexible floor space also make it an exceptional venue for special events.

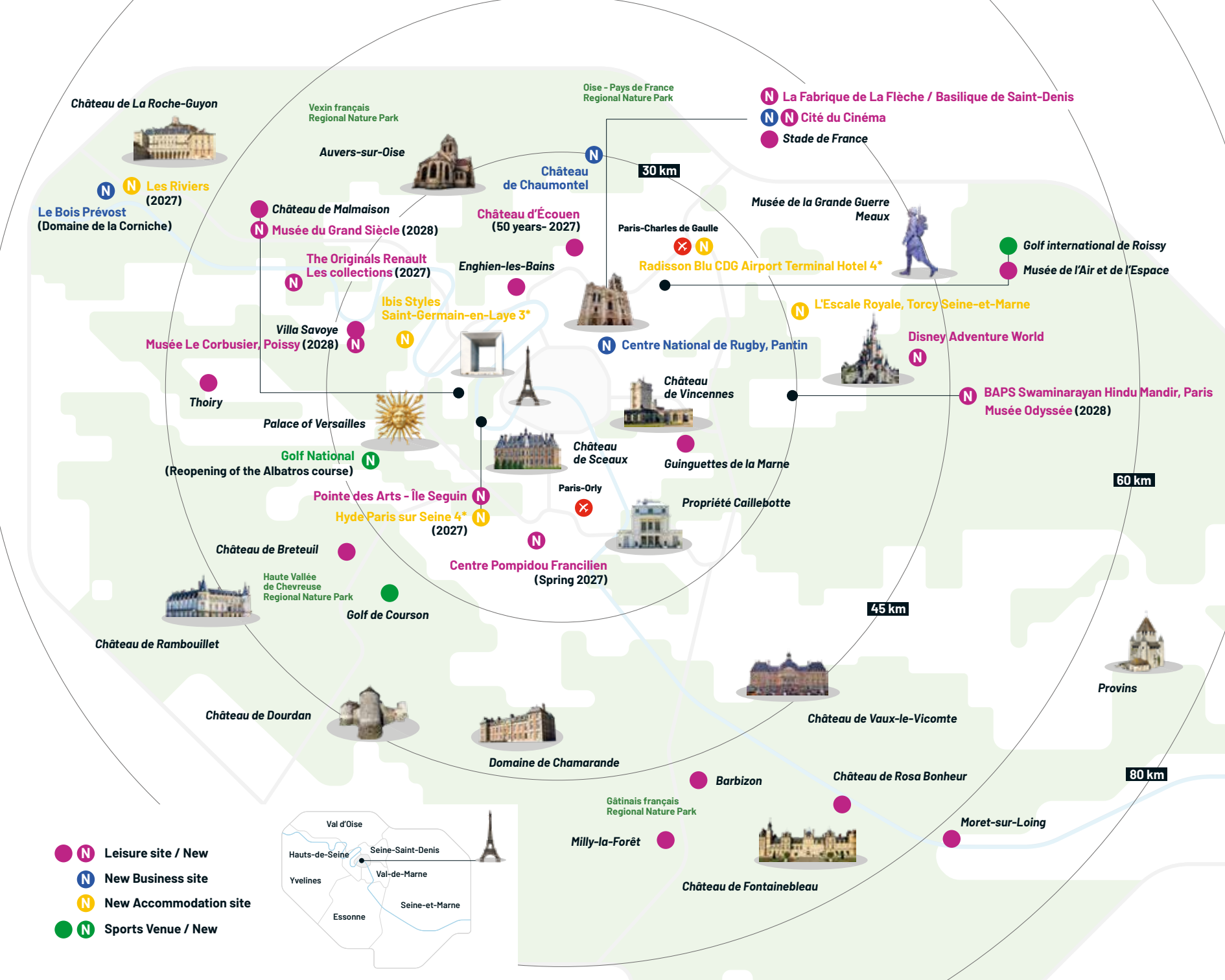

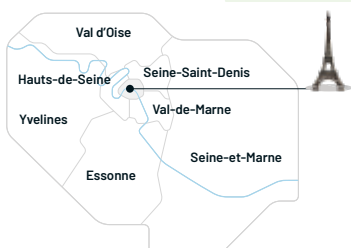

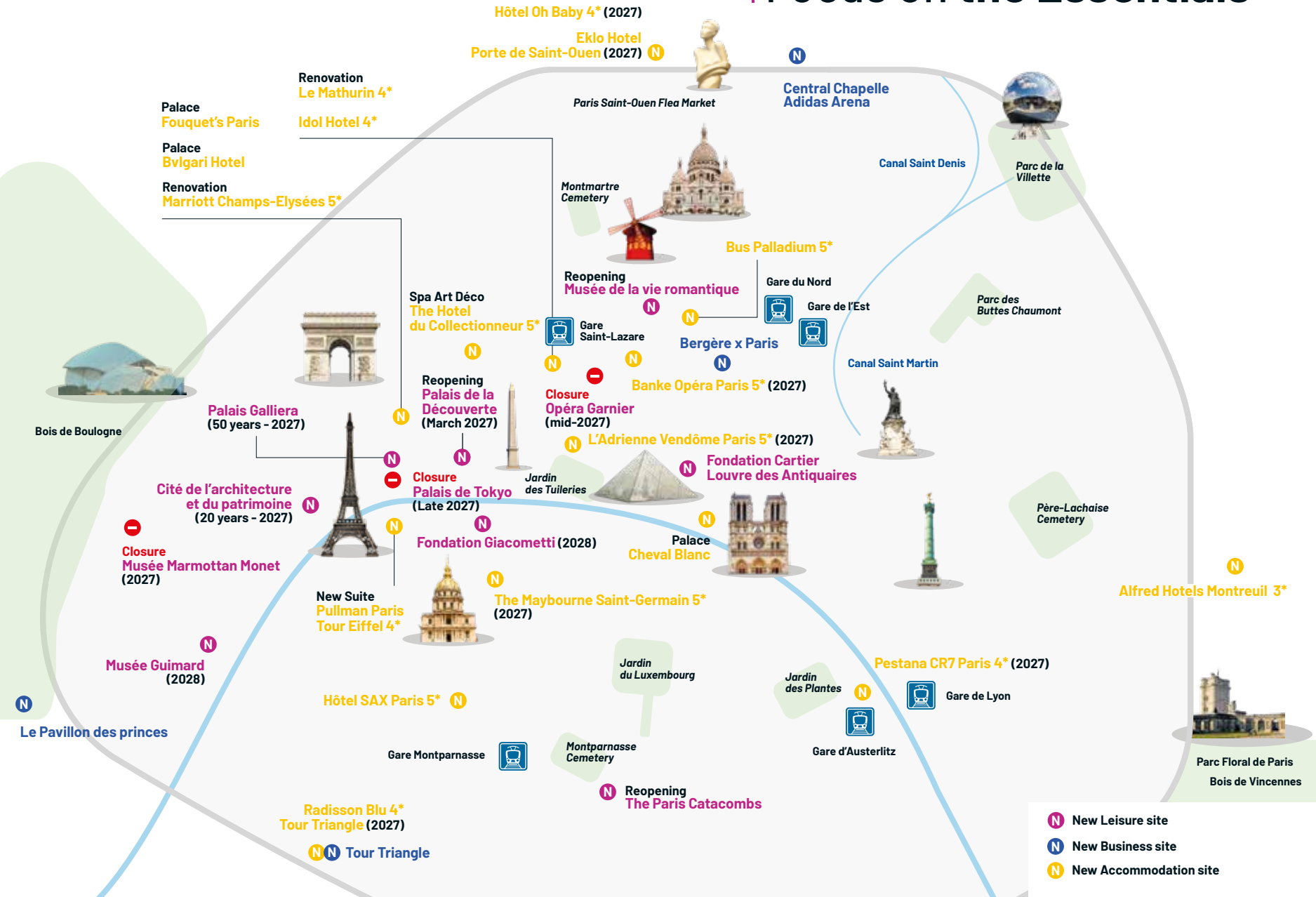

Having already made a name for itself through La Seine Musicale, Île Seguin is continuing its transformation into a new cultural hub with Pointe des Arts – Île Seguin. Large, the spacious contemporary art centre, is unveiling its inaugural exhibition there.

These 11.5 hectares on the Seine are surrounded by must-see sites: the Domaine national de Saint-Cloud, Sèvres-Cité de la Céramique, the Musée Albert Kahn and Gardens, and Tour aux Figures de Jean Dubuffet on Île Saint-Germain.

Giverny, Monet's house, the Japanese bridge

On to Giverny, Monet's ultimate personal paradise, with its famous garden, Japanese bridge and pond... A final cycle ride towards Vernon, taking in the poplar-lined landscapes that inspired Monet to paint a series of 23 canvases. Return to Paris on the *NOMAD* train.



Day 2



Paysage. Vétheuil, musée d'Orsay

Arrival in Vétheuil, Monet's final stop in Paris Region, where he created nearly 200 paintings. After getting back on your bike, a short stop at La Roche-Guyon and its fortress with breathtaking views over the Seine.

Maison Impressionniste

A stop in Argenteuil, at the Maison Impressionniste, where Claude Monet lived and painted around 259 canvases. Back on the Transilien, heading for Mantes-la-Jolie, for a cycle ride along the Seine and its scenery.

In Paris, discover his works at the Musée d'Orsay (the world's finest collection of Impressionist art), the Musée Marmottan Monet (the world's finest collection of works by Claude Monet and Berthe Morisot), and the Musée de l'Orangerie. Set out from Saint-Lazare station on Transilien line J, with a bike.

Go further by bike

The region has four major cycle routes:

The Avenue Verte Paris–London,

a route linking the two capitals, passing by Notre-Dame Cathedral, the banks of the Seine and the Oise, and the Vexin Français Regional Nature Park.

The Véloscénie,

a cycle route linking Paris to Mont-Saint-Michel, passing by the châteaux of Versailles, Sceaux and Rambouillet, and the Haute Vallée de Chevreuse Regional Nature Park.

The Scandibérique,

a route following the historic pilgrims' route from Trondheim (Norway) to Santiago de Compostela (Spain), passing through Paris, along the Canal de l'Ourcq, the châteaux of Fontainebleau and Nemours, and the Canal du Loing.

The Seine à Vélo,

a cycle route between Paris and the coast that runs alongside the Seine Valley and its Impressionist landscapes, passing through Saint-Denis, Chatou, Saint-Germain-en-Laye, Conflans-Sainte-Honorine and La Roche-Guyon.

Art at the Stations

The Grand Paris Express will eventually comprise 68 new stations, 80 per cent of which will be connected to other modes of transport. Villejuif-Gustave-Roussy station, designed by the French architect Dominique Perrault, and Saint-Denis-Pleyel station, designed by the Japanese architect Kengo Kuma, have been recognised as two of the seven most remarkable stations in the world.

In and around these stations, there will be more than 70 works of contemporary art and over 70 large-scale illustrations created on the platforms by artists from a variety of fields, such as illustration, animated film, comic books and graphic design.

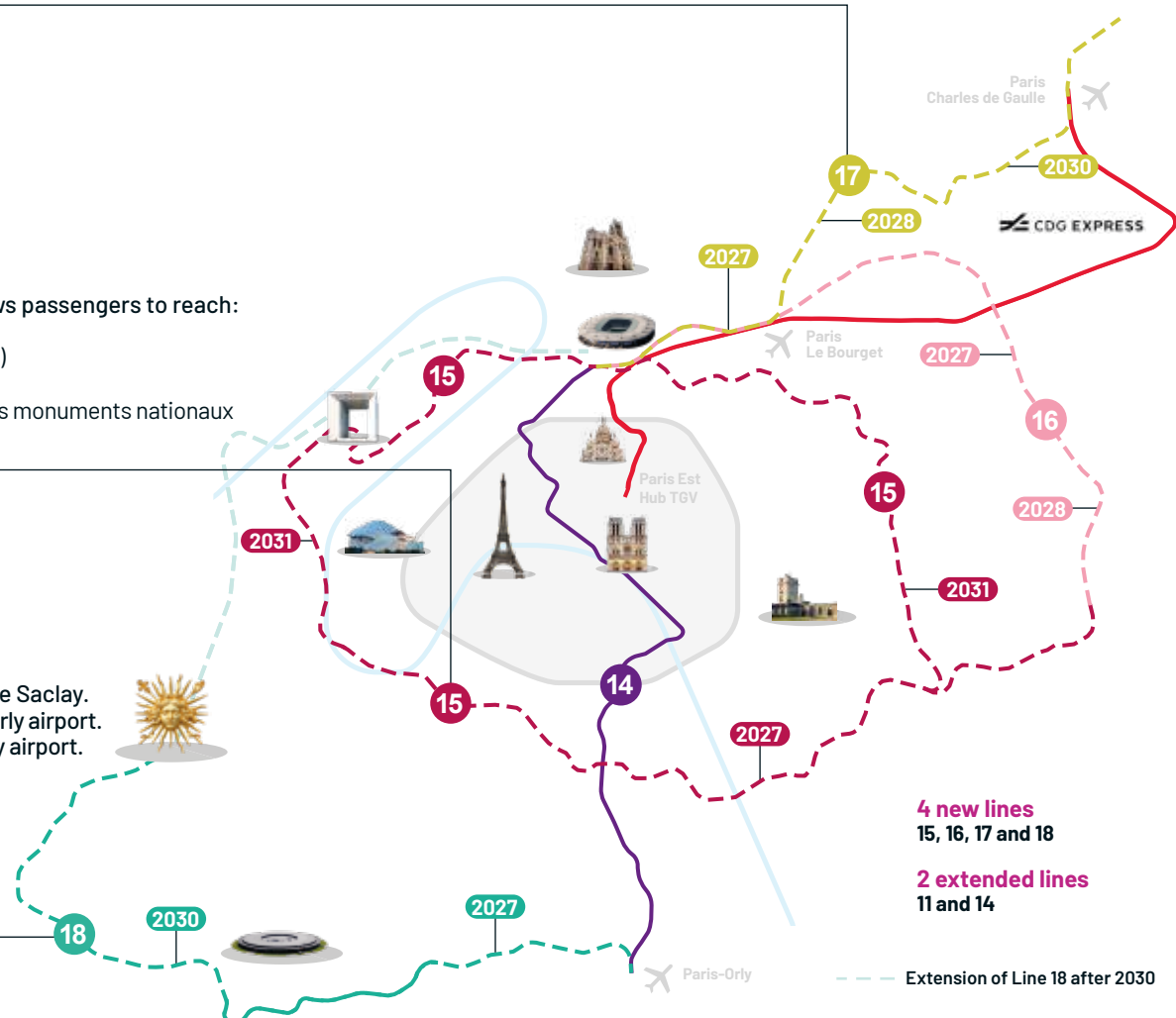

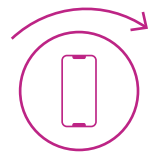

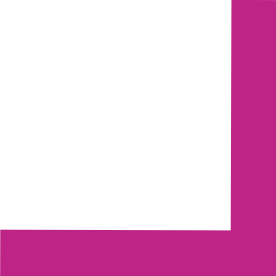
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
